<b>Arrive [Night 1]</b>		<b>Wooburn Park</b> Get checked in and take a stroll down to Wooburn Park, with a huge open space, great play area and the Wye Chalk Stream running through it. A small stroll into Wooburn Green opens up the option for a swift half at the pub, coffee or ice cream!	<b>Local Grub</b> Take the hassle out of your first night meal by using our on site catering (Fri/Sat), or buy some local produce from our shop to do a quick BBQ on one of our specialised fire pits.
